Who are The Friends of St John's C of E Primary School?

The Friends are a registered charity which raises valuable funds on behalf of the school. The money raised is spent on equipment and resources to enhance the school's facilities and our children's educational experiences.

The Friends of St John's C of E Primary School embodies the Christian ethos and diversity of our school therefore we seek to serve and support others as well as our school community. The Christian ethos is at the centre of all that we do and this is reflected when organising and planning events. Not all of our events are run as fundraisers; we also arrange fun events for the children such as a communal Easter Egg Hunt.

All families are automatically members of The Friends of St John's C of E Primary School when their child joins our school and all parents and members of the school community are encouraged to get involved in a number of different ways.

Role of The Friends of St John's Committee

The Friends of St John's C of E Primary School committee meets once a month to discuss fundraising ideas, plan events and implement ideas. We also meet at smaller working groups meeting, as necessary, when we are planning larger events. Everyone is welcome to attend these meetings.

Class Representatives

Our class representatives are the important link between the committee and the wider school community. We are looking for class representatives to undertake this important role for the new September intake.

How you can get involved

There are lots of ways you can help and support your child through The Friends of St John's C of E Primary School including offering to help before events or at other times during the year. It doesn't matter if you can't help on a regular basis, or even if you cannot come into the school, all support is appreciated. There are always jobs that can be done from home if you have half an hour to spare e.g. wrapping gifts, preparing raffle tickets etc. We really couldn't achieve what we do without the heroes working behind the scenes.

How The Friends of St John's raise money

The Friends of St John's C of E Primary School funds are spent on the 'extras' that are not provided by the school's budget, thus making our children's learning experiences even more fulfilling and exciting. We always endeavor to spend our funds in ways that will benefit all our children across all age ranges, year groups, areas of the school and curriculum.
