Mathematics

This term we will focus on consolidating our prior mathematical knowledge and deepening our learning with the following topics:

- Place value and rounding of large numbers
- Interpreting negative numbers
- Place value of numbers with up to three decimal places
- Multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1,000
- Properties of number (multiples, factors and common factors)
- Prime and composite numbers
- Multiply and divide mentally
- Solving word problems
- Add and subtract using a range of strategies
- Fractions

We will understand how faith is expressed in Islam and we will learn some new terms including:

Computing

To create a simple computer game by developing the skill of coding.

Science
