Dear St John's families,

It has been a pleasure this week to hear the teachers speaking with families and sharing with me the supportive exchanges that have happened. The teachers, staff and children have all worked very hard this half term and all deserve a break over half term.

Part of my role as Headteacher is to be aware of the national picture for education. One of the things that is happening both locally and nationally, at the moment, is increased staff absence matched with huge difficulties in getting supply teachers.

As a school, consistency for the children is very important and so we are working hard when we get staff illness to put in place the same adult when we can. The governors and I have also been working on a longer term plan that means, where possible, we can cover staff absence within our team. Of course it is never ideal when the children do not have their class teacher but the staff and I will always work hard to create as much stability as we can. One of the consequences of the current situation is that we can be rather stretched in our day to day work when we are stepping into other roles. We are working hard to avoid the difficult decision some schools have had to take, which is to close classes due to lack of staff.

Thank you for your continued support as we try to navigate the new challenges that we keeping being presented with.

Here are some ideas for you:

We are very excited that when we return from half term it will not be long until we can begin to decorate for Christmas. We have a special task for all the children, so that we have all taken part in the decorations.

We would like you to design and make a star which will be used to hang from the ceiling to decorate the hall/studio which will be a wonderful focal point for the school.

The star should be at least 20cm in height and no larger than 40cm. It can be any colours you like and can be as sparkly as you like. Please do not make it too heavy as we need to hang each start from string, however you are welcome to make it as 3D as you like.

We look forward to seeing how creative and imaginative you can be when designing your star and selecting what materials to use.

Please bring your star to school with a piece or ribbon or string securely attached of about ½ metre and your name written clearly but discreetly on it.

Your completed star should be handed to your class teacher by **Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> November 2021** We look forward to a stunning star filled hall and studio in which to enjoy our festivities.

In our first meeting, we discussed how at school we would like to see compost bins because at the end of our break we currently throw any fruit scraps into the bin. If we had compost bins we could put our fruit scraps in there and they would be turned into compost which is more environmentally friendly than sending it to the landfill. In our next meeting, we are going to research how to compost properly. Our long term goal is to be able to use our compost to grow vegetables at school.
