We will be looking at the text 'Varjack Paw' by SF Said. Through this text we will develop comprehension, inference and prediction skills in reading and will also use this text to inspire our writing of:

- A poem
- A newspaper report
- A narrative

- Multiples of ten
- Formal written multiplication
- Division Problem solving - sharing and grouping
- Division - two and three-digit numbers by one-digit numbers including halving
- Multiplication, division and fractions - scaling and correspondence problems
- Division - long division
- Units of time; Digital and analogue time telling; Estimating time and calculating time durations.

### Art/D.T.

**Art:** Observational drawing, sketching and watercolour painting of historical artefacts and creating a viking shield using printing technique and materials  
**D.T.:** Designing, making, programming and evaluating a simple electrical system and exploring rationing recipes.

**Biology:** Water transportation in plants; identifying the different types of teeth in humans and understanding evolution and inheritance.  
**Chemistry:** Investigating soils, observing how materials change state.  
**Physics:** Magnetism, light, sound vibrations, electric circuits and the movement of the Earth.
